TAKE NOTICE that the City of Mount Pearl Municipal Plan Amendment Number 59, 2005 and Development Regulations Amendment Number 155, 2005, adopted by Council on the 25th day of October, 2005, and approved on the 8th day of November, 2005, has been registered by the Minister of Municipal and Provincial Affairs.

In general terms, the purpose of Municipal Plan Amendment Number 59, 2005 is to re-designate property to the rear of 59 Clyde Avenue from Open Space-Recreation to Industrial. In general terms, the purpose of Development Regulations Amendment Number 155, 2005 is to re-zone this property to the rear of 59 Clyde Avenue from Recreational Open Space (OS) to Industrial-Light (LI). These amendments would accommodate the expansion of the City Depot facility.

The Mount Pearl Municipal Plan Amendment Number 59, 2005 and Development Regulations Amendment Number

NOTICE OF REGISTRATION CITY OF MOUNT PEARL DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS AMENDMENT NUMBERS 157, 158, 159, 160, 2005

TAKE NOTICE that the City of Mount Pearl Development Regulations Amendment Number 157, 2005, adopted by Council on the 8th day of November, 2005, and Development Regulations Amendment Numbers 158, 159, and 160, 2005, adopted by Council on the 22nd day of November, 2005, have been registered by the Minister of Municipal and Provincial Affairs.

In general terms, the purpose of Development Regulations Amendment Number 157, 2005 is to provide Council and other utility authorities the flexibility to give consideration to accessory buildings and structures on easements where

the location of such buildings and structures within the easement do not constitute a safety or health hazard.

In general terms, the purpose of Development Regulations Amendment Number 158, 2005 is to provide Council with the authority to permit a proposal, such as a front yard extension, that is contrary to the building line setback standard of the zone but does not conflict with the established development pattern of the street.

In general terms, the purpose of Development Regulations Amendment Number 159, 2005 is to bring this commercial zone in line with most other commercial zones with respect to Taxi Stands in the City and to respond to a recent request for a taxi stand use at 1 Olympic Drive.

In general terms, the purpose of Development Regulations Amendment Number 160, 2005 is to reduce the maximum number of persons that are permitted to be accommodated in a family or group care centre from six (6) to four (4) persons, exclusive of staff.

The Mount Pearl Development Regulations Amendment Numbers 157, 158, 159, and 160, 2005 come into effect on the day that this notice is published in *The Newfoundland & Labrador Gazette*.
