In general terms, Municipal Plan Amendment No. 7, 2011, will re-designate an area of land off Marine Drive from Rural to Residential. Development Regulations Amendment No. 12, 2011, will re-zone the same area of land from Rural to Residential Low Density.

Municipal Plan Amendment No. 8, 2011, will re-designate an area of land off Red Cliff Road from Rural to Residential. Development Regulations Amendment No.

13, 2011, will re-zone the same area of land from Rural to Residential Low Density and Residential Subdivision Area to Residential Low Density.

Municipal Plan Amendment No. 9, 2011, will amend Plan Policy 4.4.1.16, for Open Space Requirements. Development Regulations Amendment No. 10, 2011, will amend General Development Regulations 78(1)(d), Land for Public Open Space.

Development Regulations Amendment No. 14, 2011, will re-zone an area of land off St. Francis Road and connection to Pine Line, from Residential Subdivision Area to Residential Low Density.

The TOWN OF LOGY BAY-MIDDLE COVE-OUTER COVE Municipal Plan Amendment Nos. 7, 8 and 9, 2011 and Development Regulations Amendment Nos. 10, 12, 13 and 14, 2011, comes into effect on the day that this notice is published in *The Newfoundland and Labrador Gazette*. Short title                    **1.** These regulations may be cited as the *Court Security Regulations*.

Definitions                    **2.** In these regulations

- (a) "Act" means the *Court Security Act, 2010*;
- (b) "fluoroscope machine" means a mechanical device which uses x-rays and a fluorescent screen to display images in real time; and
- (c) "metal detector" means a mechanical device for the detection of metal objects which may be hand-held or stationary.

Screening and search methods

**3.** The screening authorized under sections 5 and 6 of the Act may be accomplished by one or more of the following methods:

- (a) by requiring a person to pass through a stationary metal detector;
- (b) by passing a hand-held metal detector near or around a person's body;
- (c) by using a fluoroscope machine to examine the contents of a person's personal possessions or clothing;
- (d) through a physical search of the contents of a person's personal possessions or clothing by a security officer; or
- (e) by a frisk search in the manner authorized under the Act.

Exemption to screening requirements

**4.** Judges, court employees, security officers, wildlife officers, and other persons in the discretion of the High Sheriff are exempt from screening under the Act.

Persons authorized to possess a weapon

**5.** The following persons may possess a weapon in a court area:

- (a) a security officer;
- (b) a participant in a court proceeding who is
  - (i) required to possess the weapon as part of the court proceeding, or
  - (ii) authorized by a judge to possess a weapon as part of the court proceeding; and

- (c) a person authorized by a security officer on duty at a particular courthouse where the security officer has reason to believe that the person will not use the weapon to cause death or injury to, or threaten or intimidate a person.

Judicial power  
unaffected

**6. Nothing in these regulations derogates from or replaces**

- (a) the power of a judge at common law or otherwise to control the proceedings of the court;
- (b) the power of a judge to give directions to a security officer incidental to the exercise of a contempt power;
- (c) the right of the chief judge or a judge in the exercise of judicial functions; or
- (d) the administrative power of the chief judge to direct and control the precincts of a courthouse.

Short title                    **1.** These regulations may be cited as the *Court Areas and Re-  
stricted Zones Regulations*.

Definition                    **2.** In these regulations, "Act" means the *Court Security Act, 2010*.

Court areas designated

**3.** (1) For the purpose of the Act, an area occupied or used by a court for conducting judicial business and administrative matters relating to it is designated as a court area.

(2) An area referred to in subsection (1) includes the entrance and exit ways associated with that area, and another area which may be part of the curtilage of that area.

(3) In addition to subsection (1), the areas listed in the schedule are designated as court areas for the purpose of the Act.

Restricted zones

**4.** The following parts of a court area are designated as restricted zones:

- (a) judge's chambers and libraries;
- (b) storage areas;
- (c) prisoner detention areas;
- (d) jury rooms;
- (e) a part of a court area used exclusively by judges, court employees or security officers; and
- (f) an area, the entrance to which is marked with a restricted zone sign.

Identification of restricted zone

**5.** A restricted zone shall be identified by a sign which reads "Authorized Personnel Only".

Authorization to enter restricted zone

**6.** (1) Only the following persons may enter a restricted zone:

- (a) a judge or court employees;
- (b) a security officer; and
- (c) another person authorized by a judge or security officer under the authority of section 4 of the Act.

(2) Notwithstanding paragraphs (1)(b) and (c),

(a) a security officer shall not enter a judge's chambers unless that security officer is authorized to do so by a judge; and

(b) a security officer shall not authorize a person to enter a judge's chambers.

(3) Subsection (2) shall not apply where a security officer reasonably believes an emergency exists in a judge's chambers, and a security officer or another person authorized by a security officer may enter a judge's chambers for the purpose of responding to the emergency.

Judicial power  
unaffected

**7. Nothing in these regulations derogates from or replaces**

(a) the power of a judge at common law or otherwise to control the proceedings of the court;

(b) the power of a judge to give directions to a security officer incidental to the exercise of a contempt power;

(c) the right of the chief judge or a judge in the exercise of judicial functions; or

(d) the administrative power of the chief judge to direct and control the precincts of a courthouse.

**1. Section 28.1 of the *Workplace Health, Safety and Compensation Regulations* is repealed and the following substituted:**

Deferred payment  
arrangement

**28.1** (1) Notwithstanding section 28, an employer who

(a) meets the conditions set by the commission;

- (b) enters into an arrangement to pay his or her assessment for the current year in equal instalments between April 1 and December 31; and
- (c) makes the payments in the manner and at the time required by the arrangement referred to in paragraph (b)

is not liable to the penalty required by that section.

(2) Where, during the year, the assessment due and payable by an employer for the current year changes, the amount payable under the arrangement entered into by the employer with the commission under subsection (1) shall be adjusted as required and the employer shall pay the balance of the assessment for the year, as adjusted, in equal instalments beginning on the next scheduled payment date immediately following the assessment adjustment and ending on the final scheduled payment date.

(3) Where an employer, who has entered into an arrangement with the commission under subsection (1), defaults in making a payment, in the amount or manner or at the time required under his or her arrangement with the commission, section 28 applies to the full outstanding balance.

Commencement

**2. These regulations come into force on January 1, 2012.**
